Matthew Komus will be presenting on behalf of the Exchange Biz regarding their historic walking tours and how they help to preserve

some of the district's colourful and interesting history.

Yves Labrèche, archeologist at St Boniface College, will talk about Community based ethnoarcheology.

Neil Einarson, CH&T, will talk about the maintenance, and care of what could be your most valuable artifact - your building(s).

The Manitoba Genealogical Society, the Association for Manitoba Archives, and someone from *Canada History* (formerly *The Beaver*) are all planning to make presentations.
