Museums and the Community Certificate Program in Museum Practice

Museums and the Community is the AMM's newest course in the Certificate Program in Museum Practice.

During this course you will gain knowledge of the major developments in the history of museums from the Ancient Greeks to present day Manitoba. This course will help you develop an understanding of how and why museums have changed over time as they respond to changes in society. You'll see how current changes in society and different perspectives are influencing museum work and challenging traditional practices. You'll also learn about community, how the museum interacts with the community. You'll develop skills in community analysis, museum self-assessment, and of the different types of community partnerships and their role in meeting museum goals and community needs.

This course isn't about the history of your museum, it's about your museum's future and how to get you there.

Topics will include:

- History and Philosophy of Museums
- Responding to a Changing Society
- Understanding Community
- Role of Museums for the Future
- Partnerships between Museums and Community
