

Having proper mannequins are a great way to properly display your costumes in a way that is attractive, can be tailored to fit the time period while not damaging the fabric. However, purchasing mannequins is expensive which is why you should learn how to make them.

Participants will be shown four different types of mannequins including choices of finishing touches (arms, legs, bases, etc.). *Please note that participants will be working in pairs on one mannequin torso.*
